This INTERNATIONAL SUMMER SCHOOL is part of JEAN MONNET MODULE -GOLDSTEIN "Debunking Political Uses of Denialisms and Conspiracy Theories in EU" directed by Marco Solinas.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The summer school will provide an introductory overview, through lectures offered by worldclass experts, on strategies to analyze, decode, and debunk some of the forms of political use of denialism and conspiracy theories.

An interdisciplinary perspective will be adopted, including political theory, political philosophy, history, and political science, in order to offer a wide-ranging analysis of the phenomena being considered.

COURSE TARGET

The summer school is open to anyone interested in the topic, from undergraduate students, PhD students and post doc to journalists and policymakers. In selecting applications, however, preference will be given to doctoral students and post doc, particularly from the area of political science. Enrollment fee 100 \in .

TRAINING OBJECTIVES

The training objectives are to offer analytical tools that will first and foremost enable the interpretation and decoding of the processes by which denialism and conspiracy theories are used in political terms in order to gain consensus.

TEACHING METHODS

The summer school offers 32 hours of classes spread over 5 days. It will take place at the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna in Pisa. Lectures and seminars activities will be offered in order to co-involve participants in the production of papers and presentations. The main preparatory texts will be provided preliminarily.

He published in important international reviews including Philosophy and Social Criticism, Critical Horizons, Zeitscrift für kritische Theorie, Philosophisches Jahrbuch, and he is the author of Via Platonica zum Unbewussten (2012), From Aristotle's Teleology to Darwin's Genealogy (2015).

Knight is a professor of American Studies at the University of Manchester.

His research is on conspiracy theories, and the economic humanities.

He is the author of "Conspiracy Culture" (2000), "The Kennedy Assassination" (2007), "Reading the Market "(2016), and is co-author of "Invested (2022) and Conspiracy Theories in the Time of Covid-19" (2023).

He is co-editor of the Routledge Handbook of Conspiracy Theories (2020).

NADIA URBINATI

Tuesday afternoon 2-4 p.m. Lecture by <u>Nadia Urbinati</u>: "Conspiracy: Systemic and Pragmatic"

Urbinati is the Kyriakos Tsakopoulos Professor of Political Theory at Columbia University. She is a political theorist specializing in modern and contemporary political thought and the democratic and anti-democratic traditions.

She has been a member of the School of Social Sciences of the Institute for Advanced Study, Visiting Fellowship at Princeton University, permanent visiting professor at the Scuola Superiore di Studi Universitari e Perfezionamento Sant'Anna of Pisa.

She has published numerous works including Me The People: "How Populism Transforms Democracy" (2019) and "Democracy Disfigured: Opinion, Truth and the People" (2014).

Tuesday afternoon: 4-6 p.m. Lecture by Michael Butter: "A Short History of Conspiracy Theories"

Butter is Professor of American Literary and Cultural History at the University of Tübingen since 2014. He is the author of four monographs: "The Epitome of Evil: Hitler in American Fiction, 1939-2002" (2009), "Plots, Designs, and Schemes: American Conspiracy Theories from the Puritans to the Present" (2014), "Der »Washington-Code«: Zur Heroisierung amerikanischer Präsidenten, 1775-1865" (2016), and "The Nature of Conspiracy Theories" (2020). He is the Principal Investigator of the ERC project "Populism and Conspiracy Theory" and one of the PI's of the CHANSE project "Researching Europe, Digitilisation and Conspiracy Theory".

Lecture by Michael Butter: "Populism and Conspiracy Theory"

Levantesi is a climate journalist and author. Her main areas of expertise are climate denial, delay, obstruction and disinformation, greenwashing, corporate responsibility on the climate crisis and climate change communication. Her book "I bugiardi del clima" (Climate Liars), published by Laterza 2021, investigates the history of climate change denial and obstruction strategies to climate action. She is the author of Gaslit, and she is a TEDx Talk speaker.

Her works have been published on DeSmog, Nature Italy, The New Republic, Internazionale, BBC World Service, DW and others.

Jensen is a historian at the Center for Research on Antisemitism at the Technische Universität in Berlin and its deputy director.

His research interests are the history of antisemitism, of German Jewry, of psychoanalysis, of the history of emotions as well as visual history.

He has previously worked at the University of Sussex, the Universität Göttingen and the Max Planck Institute for Human Development. His most recent publications include "Zornpolitik" (2017), "Wie die Couch nach Kalkutta kam: Eine Globalgeschichte der frühen Psychoanalyse" (2019) and "Ein antisemitischer Doppelmord" (2022).
